The *Big Dog* steel sculpture was unveiled on Wednesday, September 7th. Dr. Marshall Meadors III and Mayor Terence Roberts presided over the group gathered to greet the new arrival.

City engineer Mandy Baker unveiled the *Big Dog*, a creation of artist Dale Rogers from Haverhill, Massachusetts. Dr. Meadors spotted the sculpture and immediately recognized that the 8' *Big Dog* was a perfect fit for the Dog Park, the fourth community improvement project of the tba 100.

Dr. Meadors thanked the City of Anderson for their collaboration and attention to this project as well as their ongoing care of the Dog Park itself.
