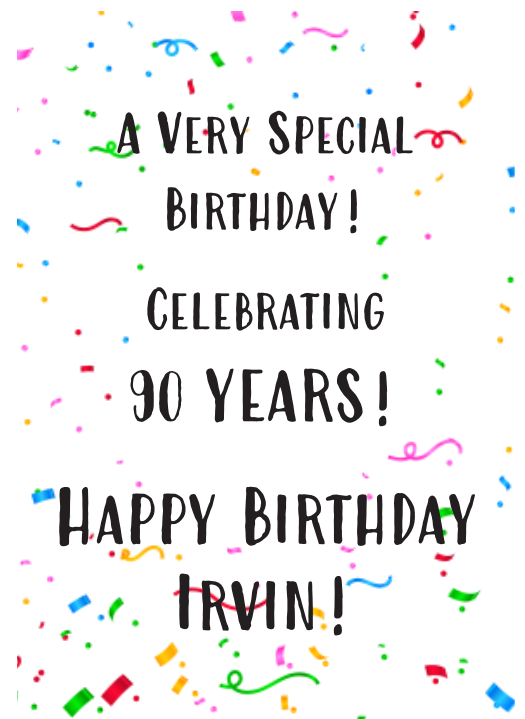

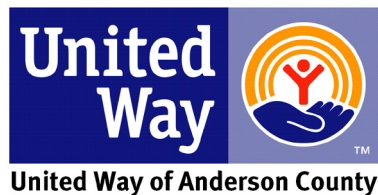
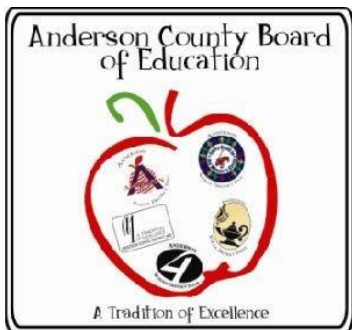

## THE COMMUNITY CENTER BUILDING HISTORY OF A COLLABORATIVE EFFORT

In September 2003, Foothills Community Foundation negotiated the purchase of the Central Carolina Bank building at 907 North Main Street. The United Way of Anderson County, the Anderson Area Chamber of Commerce and Partners for a Healthy Community joined the Foundation in the building after upfitting, while the bank continued operations on the ground floor. This collaboration was formed to enable nonprofit organizations to maximize their resources in a shared location.

Today, the building's future appears brighter than ever with the recent purchase by Anderson University, whose plans for the site include support for the AU College of Engineering.
